AWHONN Intermediate Fetal Monitoring Course

The updated AWHONN Intermediate Fetal Monitoring Course 7th Edition is a one-day instructor-led course with online prerequisite education. Please note: Participants will have access to the online learning prerequisite material for 30 days before the course. The online access will end one day before the in-person course. Per AWHONN instruction guidelines, no entry will be allowed without completion of all prerequisite learning.

The instructor-led portion of the course will include didactic content as well as hands-on skills stations. To complete the course, the participant must also complete an online integration test. Online test success is delineated by a minimum score of 80% (40 out of 50 questions).

11.25 CNE/CME contact hours are provided for completion of the course in its entirety.

This course is designed for RNs and MDs who have previously completed a Basic or Foundations FHM course and who use fetal heart assessment and monitoring technology in an antepartum or intrapartum setting.

Neonatal education classes

Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP)

The new Neonatal Resuscitation Program includes two curriculum levels: Essentials and Advanced.

Requirements are:

- Study materials from the Textbook of Neonatal Resuscitation, 8th ed.
- Completion of the new Online Learning Assessment (OLA)
 - NRP Essentials – completion of 1–4 lessons
 - NRP Advanced – completion of 1–11 lessons and NRP Advanced Exam
- Completion of an instructor-led NRP Essentials or NRP Advanced Provider Course, Simulation and Debriefing within 90 days of successfully completing OLA

Participants will be responsible for completing the online requirements and must bring online verification (Essentials eCredential) to the Instructor-led Provider Course on the day of the course. There is NO cost for the Skills session. After Perinatal Systems receives your registration form, you will receive a confirmation letter and instructions for accessing the NRP Learning Platform.

S.T.A.B.L.E.

The S.T.A.B.L.E. program provides general guidelines for the assessment and stabilization of sick infants in the post-resuscitation/pre-transport stabilization period. The course is designed for all healthcare personnel who provide care for well or sick infants.

The S.T.A.B.L.E. pre-test must be completed before attending the class. It will be sent to you by Perinatal Systems with your registration confirmation. S.T.A.B.L.E. books are not required to complete the pre-test and will be provided to you on the day of the class to use as a reference. Perinatal emergency simulations

During January, our OB and Neonatal Outreach Educators will reach out to each hospital to arrange in-situ simulations/scenarios for hands-on skills/management. These sessions will be separate from the SimCOACH™ sessions, and no contact hours will be offered.

The topics will be determined with input from each director/nurse manager, and the dates will be spaced throughout the year. This will be a golden opportunity for hospitals to receive specific skills sessions to meet their competency, Joint Commission or identified knowledge deficit needs.

Perinatal emergency simulations on the mobile *SimCOACH™*

2022 marks the seventh year that the S.C. Birth Outcomes Initiative (BOI) and Prisma Health/University of South Carolina School of Medicine Columbia Simulation Center have worked together to provide on-site simulations via the mobile *SimCOACH™*. New scenarios are developed each year to provide comprehensive, realistic maternal and neonatal simulation experiences and are facilitated by MFMs, Perinatal Systems outreach educators, and Sim Center team members. Previous scenarios have included:

- Obstetric emergencies: shoulder dystocia, hemorrhage, intrauterine resuscitation, hypertensive crisis, seizures, etc.
- Neonatal emergencies that corresponded with maternal scenarios
